from the PASTOR



As we move into the season of Advent, we reflect on the hope, peace, joy, and love that prepare our hearts for Christmas. This Advent I will not be preaching on this traditional theme, choosing instead to look at our past for inspiration by preaching four sermons from my predecessors, Earl Davis, Billy Nimmons, Bill Ireland, and Bill Wilson. In doing so, this will conclude our time spent looking at our roots. In the New Year we will focus on what is blossoming in the branches of our tree of faith at FBC Dalton.

What stories are you telling about Christmas? What stories have you told in the past? What are you hoping for this Christmas season? How do you proclaim Christ is coming?

What we learn from the Advent story is everyone has a story, a hope, an expectation of what Christ's coming will mean during this season. The first prophets to proclaim the coming of the Messiah had hopes for how God's arrival might change the world, too. Isaiah hoped that the Messiah would bring a new spirit of wisdom and understanding. He envisioned a resurgence of righteousness and a new day of justice and equity for the poor and the marginalized.

Much closer to the beginning of Christ's ministry, John the Baptist did the same thing. As he announced the arrival of the Messiah, John the Baptist hoped for a day when God would be revealed in new and powerful ways, and he encouraged his followers to prepare for the arrival of Christ through acts of generosity and by living with integrity.

And even as Mary was nurturing Jesus in her womb, she looked forward to a day characterized by God's mercy when the powerful would be humbled and the lowly lifted up—when the hungry would be filled and the rich sent away empty-handed.

What are you hopeful to see in your family, in our church, in our community, and in the world? What stories do you hope come to pass this Christmas season? Here are some of my hopes for us.

#### Hopes for our Families:

I want our families to be healthy and happy. I want God and God's love to be central to our families' lives. I want our family members to be understanding and forgiving of one another. We long for reconciliation and support—for restoration of frayed relationships.

#### Hopes for our Church:

I want a growing sense of togetherness and unity in our church. I want us to be a loving and welcoming community to all who come through our doors. I want us to know each other better and share in each other's lives more.

I hope that our church will be a leader in our community as we reach out to those who need Christ's comfort and encouragement. I want us to stand out and stand apart as we become more willing to take stands for Christ that distinguish us from the world. I hope for spiritual health today, for clear direction and purpose as we look toward our future.

#### Hopes for our Community:

I want us to continue to engage in our community, to be on the front line to help with hunger and poverty. I want us to continue to help the homeless and those on the margins. I want us to help find ways to unite us, not divide us. *Hopes for the World:* 

My hope for the world is that the world would know that God is love. My second hope is for peace. Peace meaning more than the absence of violence, but a genuine sense of harmony and fellowship among all people.

What are your hopes for this Christmas season? When we express our hopes about how Christ might change our families, our church, our community, and the world at Christmas, we begin to engage in prophetic work. But expressing God-inspired hope is only part of work. To finish the prophetic task, we must begin to do the things that will turn our hopes into reality.

At Christmas we tell stories and we are encouraged to hope. And, at Christmas, we are emboldened to act, knowing that God goes before us into the world.


